

A Tract of land in Shelby County, Kentucky on the waters of the Elk Creek, and thus described:

Beginning in the center of Elk Creek opposite a branch corner to Mansfield Stodghill; thence up Elk Creek with its meanders S 86 ½ E, 15 poles; S 38 E. 41 ¾ poles; S 68 E. 18 poles to a point in the line of Hardesty; thence with the line of same N. 45 W. 7.50 poles to the mouth of branch; thence with 1 line of Hardesty N. 42 E. 25 ¾ poles; to a beech in line of same; thence with line of same N 78 E. 70 ½ poles to a mulberry tree; thence N. 7 ½ E. 68 poles to a stone; thence N. 11 ½ E 42 ½ poles to a stake in a drain corner to Proctors; thence with Proctors Line N. 74 ½ W 34 poles; thence down a branch with its meanders. S. 60 W. 18 poles S. 55 W. 20 poles; S. 38 W. 12 ½ poles to a stake corner to Stodghill; thence with Stodghill's line S. 60 W. 40 poles; S. 65 W. 32 poles; S. 48 W 38 poles to Elk Creek; thence N. 80 W. 78 poles to two beeches and two sugar tree; thence S. 72 E. 91 ½ poles to the beginning, containing 77.20 acres, more or less.
